British Waterways are holding a 'Spring Clean Week' in Middlewich 18th to 24th March. The spruce up of the canal areas will include painting/scrub clearing and litter picking.

The Middlewich Clean Team maintains a good working relationship with British Waterways staff responsible for the Middlewich canal section and were invited by Jim Taylor (the manager in charge) to assist in the activities.

Several willing members of the Clean Team turned out on Monday afternoon to help paint a length of fencing by adjacent to the canal towpath by Andersons Boat Hire. John Anderson very kindly supplied a boat to use for the week in addition to the on site BW boat.

Several members also carried out litter picks along the canal tow paths leading towards Croxton Lane and behind the Salinae.

Maxine Wrench of the Clean Team said 'Everyone who attended worked really hard and also had a lot of fun. The 'Spring Clean Week' is a real positive incentive for the town and prepares our beautiful canal sections ready for the summer visitors'.

In addition to the Spring Clean Week the Clean Team had a really successful litter pick week.

Last Monday 14 members litter picked Brook's Lane & Centurian Way and on Saturday 9 members turned out to pick a 'Grot Spot' area around King Street Industrial Estate.

We have even found some time to help Sandbach Clean Team on their first litter pick on Saturday morning. They are determined to be as successful as Middlewich and we are really pleased that both towns can work in partnership to raise litter awareness'.

The Clean Team were out in force today picking litter along St Michaels Way, Croxton Lane & Webbs Lane.

A great turn out of 14 Clean Team members braved the cold weather and collected nine bags of rubbish. Town Councillor Fred Smith also joined the Clean Team to show his support.

Clean Team recieve grant in 'Rewards for all' programme

The Middlewich Clean Team receive £2 450 grant in the 'Awards for all programme' Middlewich Cheshire, 16 January 2004:

Awards for all is a joint scheme providing lottery grants to local voluntary and community groups and the Middlewich Clean Team have successfully applied and received £ 2450 to continue their work in Middlewich. The team had already been recognized for their community work when in December '03 they received the Government award 'Taking a stand' and a £1000 cheque as one of the top 10 prizes in the UK. Although they did not win the top prize this was an excellent achievement out of over 12 000 entrants

On hearing the news, Clean Team chairperson and founder, Janet Chisholm said, "This is excellent news for both the Clean Team and the local community. We have only been going for one year but in that time Middlewich has seen dramatic improvements which are down to both the hard work of the 30 or so volunteers in my team and also from the help and hard work of the local borough councils that we work so closely with."

It is the intention of the team to use the award money for the benefit of the town, by investing it into educating the local school children about the importance of keeping their town clean and tidy. Other areas of spend highlighted by the team are display boards, display material, tabards, pickers and gloves and the development of a web site. The Middlewich Clean Team receive £1000 Government award in the 'Making A Stand' awards.

On 4th December the founder member of the Middlewich Clean Team, Janet Chisholm along with committee member Diana Turner, visited the House of Commons and collected a cheque for £1000 from Hazel Blears, MP and Minister for the Anti Social Behaviour Unit. In October Last year the Government launched their action plan

'Together: Tackling Anti Social behaviour' and the Middlewich Clean Team have been awarded one of 30 national awards for their work in the local community.

Since forming in February 2003, The Clean Team volunteers have carried out many activities in the community including litter picking, graffiti cleaning and bulb planting. The group has now gained momentum and has 30 active members keeping their own local area of Middlewich tidy. Partly due to their own work and for their joint work with the local council, Middlewich has received recognition in the form of winning the large village, small town category award in the Best Kept Village competition, The Community Vibrancy Award in the Community Pride Competition which was sponsored by Shell and Most Improved Town in the North West in Bloom awards.
